

Investigations Division

These crimes are classified into <u>3 primary categories</u>: *crimes against property* (thefts, hit and runs, criminal mischief, etc...), *crime against persons* (battery, burglary, sexual misconduct, etc...), and *cyber investigations* (forensic examination of telecommunication devices: computers, external hard drives, phones).

Training Division

- Cyber Intelligence Training
 - WMPD hosted a Cyber Intelligence training put on by Indiana State Police. All detectives in the county attended along with some from surrounding agencies. This training taught detectives the latest and most effective ways to understand, extract, and analyze cell phone data. This data included better understanding tower and cell phone extractions.
- Department Training
 - WMPD officers completed communications skills training. In this training course, officers learned the most effective techniques to speaking with citizens in mental health crisis and under the influence of drugs and alcohol.
 - Officers completed a course on mentorship. This course introduced officers into the importance of having a mentor and being a mentor for others.
 - Several officers attended a county wide training that emphasized the importance and how to de-escalate and communicate with individuals with IDD (Intellectual Disabilities and Development).
 - We had one supervisor attend a leadership and development training conference in St. Louis. This conference highlighted what police departments are successfully doing around the country. This conference allowed WMPD to connect and network with departments across the nation.
- K9
 - Officer Lushin attended K9 Olympics in northern Indiana. The K9 Olympics had over 130 K9 teams from the police, military, and private organizations. K9 teams competed in 25 different events. Lushin placed 3rd in the patrol scenario and 2nd overall in patrol techniques.
